SCHOOLinHUB Kick - Off Meeting

The SchoolinHUB project officially launched with its Kick-Off Meeting on January 8–9, 2025, in Nicosia, Cyprus. Partners from across Europe came together to align on the project's goals, share expectations, and outline strategies to foster inclusion and empowerment for migrant children and their families. This meeting set the stage for productive collaboration and a shared commitment to achieving meaningful impact.



Open Consultation Sessions



The SCHOOLinHUB Open Consultation successfully Sessions engaged migrant parents, professionals, and community members to address challenges and shape the methodology.
