About the Project:

SCHOOLinHUB is an innovative European initiative dedicated to **fostering integration and language learning for young migrant children and their families**. By transforming schools into dynamic hubs of inclusion, the project provides a holistic approach to empower children aged 4–7, their parents, and educators in multicultural environments.

Project Aims:

The project also emphasizes the **active involvement of parents, professional development for educators, and the mobilization of local communities** to ensure long-term social cohesion.





SCHOOLinHUB Kick - Off Meeting

The **SchoolinHUB** project officially **launched** with its Kick-Off Meeting on January 8–9, 2025, in Nicosia, Cyprus. Partners from across Europe came together to **align on the project's goals, share expectations, and outline strategies** to foster inclusion and empowerment for migrant children and their families. This meeting set the stage for productive collaboration and a shared commitment to achieving meaningful impact.



Open Consultation Sessions



The SCHOOLinHUB Open Consultation Sessions successfully engaged **migrant parents, professionals, and community members** to address challenges and shape the methodology. **Each partner held two sessions** - one for parents and community members, another for professionals and school representatives (10 participants each).

Structured discussions, presentations, and interactive feedback helped **identify needs, generate solutions, and foster local partnerships**. The documented insights are now guiding project activities and outputs.



Peer To Peer Meeting in Berlin

In March 11-13, 2025, we participated in a three-day meeting at Berlin Cosmopolitan School (BCS).

The aim of the meeting was to **share our host's best practices with other partners** in their work with migrant children from different parts of the world. Participants from all 13 partner organizations in the project attended the meeting, **along with one educator from each partner country.**



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
